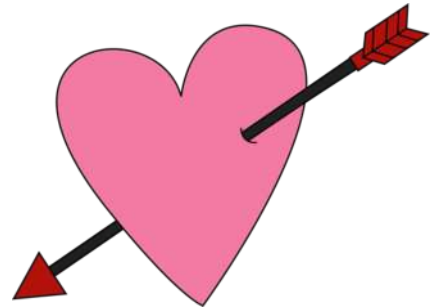
Hello Lutz Families!

- Turn off TVs and cell phones and eliminate other distractions.
- Help your child check his/her homework to be sure it is done correctly, but don't do it for him/her.

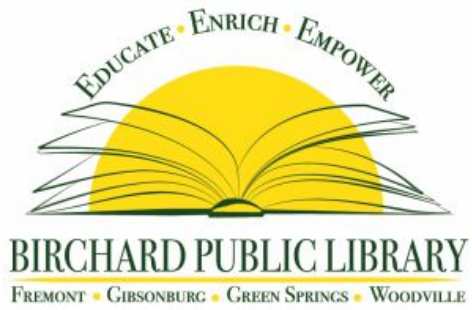

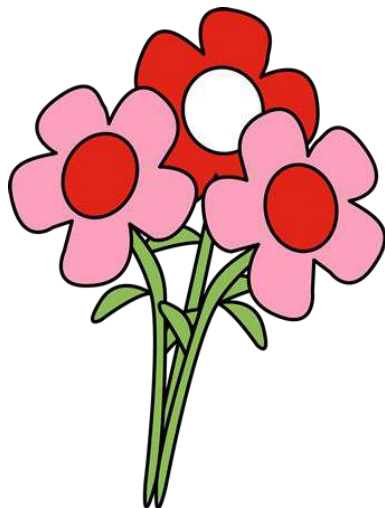
