Hello Croghan Families!

The state testing season is here and it's hard to believe that the end of this school year is just around the corner!

We kicked off the return from Spring Break with Grade 5 ELA OST testing. Here is the schedule for the rest of our Ohio State Tests:

Grade 5 ELA Make-Ups April 17
Grade 4 ELA April 18 and 19
Grade 3 ELA April 20 and 21
Grade 5 Math April 25 and 26
Grade 4 Math April 27 and 28
Grade 3 Math May 2 and 3
Grade 5 Science May 4 and 5

Grade 3 ELA will be paper/pencil again for the Spring, while all other testing will be completed online. No vacations will be excused for students on scheduled state testing dates.

As the weather fluctuates over the next several weeks, please remember to check the weather report to determine how your child should dress for school. Our Ohio weather keeps us guessing with an 80 degree day one day and then a 40 degree day the next. Teachers will also monitor to determine if students need to take jackets to recess.

Here are some dress code reminders from the Student Handbook:

- Shoes must be worn. No slippers. No flip flops or sandals for PK-8.
- Trousers, jeans, skirts, dresses, shirts, shorts, sweaters, and blouses provided that such items are of conventional length.

Unacceptable Apparel - The following are unacceptable apparel and subject to disciplinary action:

- Tank tops and low-cut tops. (All shirts must have sleeves.) Shirts, blouses, and sweaters that do not come to the top of the pants and/or expose skin when seated/standing. Articles that reveal the back, chest, upper-thigh, or undergarments. Shirts must fully cover the stomach. Ripped pants/jeans that expose skin on the upper-thigh or above, or reveal their undergarments.
- The following items are not to be worn in the building: a) hats, head coverings (unless for religious articles) or other apparel, including hair picks; b) coats designed specifically for outside wear; c) sunglasses, unless authorized by a doctor. (or for special occasion Spirit Wear days)

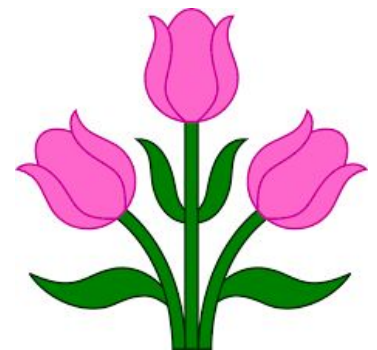

Attendance Policy

- Students are allotted 5 days of excused absences without a doctor's note in one school year.
- After 5 days of excused absences a doctor's note is needed. Otherwise absences will be considered "unexcused".
- If a student tests positive for COVID proof is needed. For example: a note sent from a doctor OR a picture of the COVID test to include student's name and date.
- If proof of COVID is presented to the office, the absences due to COVID will not count toward a student's 5 days.

Habitual Truancy

- 30 or more consecutive hours without a legitimate excuse
- 42 or more hours in one school month without a legitimate excuse
- 72 or more hours in one school year without a legitimate excuse
