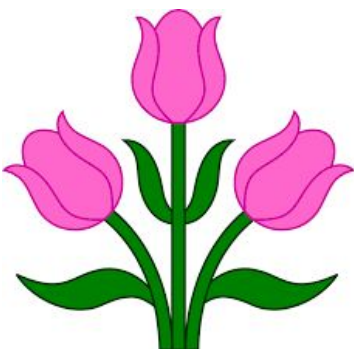

Attendance Policy

- Students are allotted 5 days of excused absences without a doctor's note in one school year.
- After 5 days of excused absences a doctor's note is needed. Otherwise absences will be considered "unexcused".
- If a student tests positive for COVID proof is needed. For example: a note sent from a doctor OR a picture of the COVID test to include student's name and date.
- If proof of COVID is presented to the office, the absences due to COVID will not count toward a student's 5 days.

Habitual Truancy

- 30 or more consecutive hours without a legitimate excuse
- 42 or more hours in one school month without a legitimate excuse
- 72 or more hours in one school year without a legitimate excuse

Hard to believe it's the end of the year! As we look forward to a summer of fun and excitement, let's remember to continue to work on our "healthy habits". 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From the School Counselor

Hello Croghan Families! It is hard to believe that we are wrapping up the 2022-2023 school year. It has been wonderful working with all of your students this year. During the summer, I encourage you to talk about self regulation. Self-regulation can go by many names, such as self-control, self management, and impulse control. It is defined as the best state of alertness of both the body and emotions for the specific situation. We used the Zones of regulation at school this year and will continue to use it next year. I encourage you to talk about the concepts of The Zones of Regulation as they apply in a variety of environments.

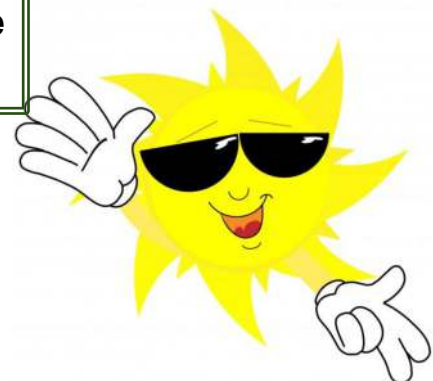
Ideas include:

- Make comments aloud so the student understands it is natural that we all experience the different Zones and use strategies to control (or regulate) ourselves. For example, “This is really frustrating me and making me go into the Yellow Zone. I need to use a tool to calm down. I will take some deep breaths.”
- Help the student gain awareness of his or her Zones and feelings by pointing out your observations.
- Validate what Zone your students are in and help them brainstorm expected ways to self-regulate so their behavior is expected for the context.
- Share with the student how his or her behavior is affecting the Zone you are in and how you feel.
- Help the student become comfortable using the language to communicate his or her feelings and needs by encouraging the student to share his or her Zone with you.
- Make sure to positively reinforce students for recognizing their Zone and managing their behaviors while in it, rather than only pointing out when students are demonstrating unexpected behaviors while in a Zone.

P-EBT Summer Update: All students who attend a CEP school (all FCS elementary schools) and all students at FMS and Ross who received free or reduced meals for the 22-23 school year will be receiving summer P-EBT benefits starting in mid June. Virtual and homeschooled students are not eligible for these benefits. The funds will all be dispersed prior to June 30, 2023. There will be a one-time disbursement of \$120.00 per student. Funds will be dispersed to cards previously administered, and new cards will be administered to newly eligible students. The phone number to report lost/misplaced cards is 1-866-386-3071. When calling, you will need to provide your name, social security number, and date of birth. The old card will then be deactivated and a new one issued. ***FCS is unable to assist with lost cards.***
