### **Summer EBT Benefits and Eligibility Date Change**

Ohio is participating this summer in the Summer EBT program, also known as SUN Bucks. Even though your elementary student receives school meals at no cost, **each child must still be approved for Summer EBT**. If you're already receiving food benefits such as SNAP/FDPIR/TANF/ETC., your student is automatically eligible for the Summer EBT program.

If you are not and your household income is less than 185% of the federal poverty level, school aged children in your household may be eligible. You can apply for Summer EBT using the application at <a href="mailto:sebt.ohio.gov">sebt.ohio.gov</a>. The date to apply for summer EBT benefits has been extended to August 16, 2024. If you have questions about the application, contact the Summer EBT Helpline at 1-866-244-0071, option 1.

You will need to provide your child's name, school, date of birth, along with the names of other people in your household, your household income, and address where you would like the benefit card to be sent. You will not need to provide any documentation to apply but could be asked to verify your information. Receiving Summer EBT will not affect children's or families' immigration status.

Participating households will receive a one-time \$120 payment for each eligible child on a benefit card you will receive in the mail. You can use the money to buy food during the summer at grocery stores, farmers markets, and other authorized retailers. If you receive more than \$120 per eligible child in your household, do not use the benefits. Contact the SEBT Helpline at 1-866-244-0071, option 1 as soon as possible to confirm or correct the error.

### **Attendance Policy**

- -Students are allotted 5 days of excused absences without a doctor's note in one school year.
- -After 5 days of excused absences a doctor's note is needed. Otherwise absences will be considered "unexcused".
- Habitual tardies add up and count toward days of absence. Please make sure your child is at school on time.
- If you know that you will be picking your child up early for an appointment, please send a note to school with them.
- -Please call in your student's absence to the school office by 9am the day that they will be out. There is voicemail so that you can call any time day or night.

### **FCS Summer Meals**

Fremont Ross High School, 1100 North Street, Fremont OH 43420 will be an open site where any guardian may pick up a meal package on Mondays from 11:30 AM - 1:00 PM for any child in their household. The meal distribution will run from June 10 through Aug 16, 2024. Meal packages will include 5 days of breakfast and 5 days of lunch in accordance with USDA's SFSP K-12 meal pattern. Pickup will be held as a drive through line in the bus turn around behind the school. Parents should enter the line through the right side of the circle by turning right from Cedar Street behind Fremont Middle School and making their way through the turn around where the meals will be distributed, then turn right to exit the line. Signs will be posted and there will be staff directing traffic.

Students receiving meals on-site during summer programming will not be eligible for meal pickup at Ross High School until their on-site programming is finished.
