


Morning Arrival

Pride is the word of the month for May. Pride is a feeling of satisfaction based on your achievements and actions. Pride comes from perseverance, patience, and wisdom. People who demonstrate strong character are proud of who they are and have high self-esteem.

Ways to Help your Child be Proud

- Set appropriate expectations-not too low and not too high. This is critical to developing competence and confidence. If expectations are too low or too high children feel powerless and incapable of controlling the circumstances in their lives.
- Allow space to test skills. Give opportunities to reflect, reason, problem-solve and consider the consequences of choices. This is critical for future growth.
- Facilitate a sense of belonging. Your child will develop a sense of importance and commitment if you give opportunities to participate and contribute in an activity. Let your child know that he/she really counts and makes a difference.
- Have pride in your family. Strong families believe in and trust each other, respect individual differences and show their affection for each other. They make time for being together, whether to share holidays, special events or just to have fun.
