Dear Ross Families,

It's hard to believe we're already into the second quarter and fast approaching the end of the first semester! The start of this school year has brought with it a sense of excitement and positivity that can be felt throughout our building. Our staff and students are working together to maintain this positive energy, and we will continue to build on this climate as the year progresses.

One of our early successes this school year has been our significant improvement in attendance. After reviewing the September data, I'm excited to share that our high school students have improved their attendance by an impressive 14.15% and reduced tardies by an outstanding 33.33% compared to last September. This represents an overall attendance improvement of 20.42% from last year! Regular attendance is crucial to your child's academic success and overall experience in school. If your child is absent, I encourage them to review their Google Classroom assignments to stay on track. Also, staying in communication with your child's teachers is key to ensuring their success in the classroom.

After Thanksgiving Break, Ross students who need to retake Ohio State Tests for competency scores will have the opportunity during the OST window from December 2nd to December 20th. It's important that students give their best effort, as these tests play a role in their graduation pathway.

The first semester will officially end on December 20th. Semester exams will begin on December 18th, and a detailed testing schedule is included in this newsletter. The schedule will also be shared through Final Forms and our school announcements.

This quarter is packed with exciting events for the Fremont community. From October 24th to 27th, we will present our fall play, and on November 7th, we will host the American Red Cross Bloodmobile. We encourage you to consider donating blood to support those in need. On November 8th, Fremont Ross High School will hold its annual Veterans Day celebration. December will bring concerts, parades, and other events showcasing many of our students. For more details, please check our school calendar or website. Additionally, our winter sports season kicks off on December 1st, and we are proud to support our talented student-athletes.

As we enter this festive season, the Ross school community extends our warmest holiday wishes to all. It's truly a great time to be a Little Giant!

ACE Mentoring at Ross High School is off to a positive start for the school year. Many relationships are being established along with exceptional mentoring happening.

ACE is a career based mentoring program that is designed to help students establish career goals, plan for their future, and succeed in school. Mentoring is held in person during a study hall, or non-core classes, and students have an opportunity to talk about the social pressures and issues that they may be experiencing. Students are encouraged to succeed in school and have good attendance.

Throughout the school year, mentors and mentees have talking points they talk about during the mentoring sessions. Topics are organizational skills, skills for smart studying, graduation, career and what their future brings. Each mentoring session always encourages academic success.

We are currently serving 9th-12th grade students at Ross High School and 6th-8th grade students at Fremont Middle School. Any Fremont City School student is eligible to participate, but students are required to complete an application and parent permission is necessary.

## Crockpot Chicken and Rice

## Ingredients

- 1 ½ cup long grain white rice
- 2 pounds boneless, skinless chicken breast trimmed and cubed
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- ½ cup white onion diced small - 1/2 a large onion
- 3 cloves garlic minced
- 1 cup celery chopped - 3 large celery ribs
- 2 cups frozen peas & carrots mix 16 oz
- 3 sprigs fresh thyme
- 3 cups chicken broth low/no salt
- ½ cup non fat greek yogurt
- ½ cup parmesan cheese
- ¼ cup milk any type



## Instructions

1. Rinse rice in a fine mesh strainer under hot running water until water runs clear.
2. Spray the slow cooker with olive oil.
3. Layer the rice in the bottom of the pot, followed by the chicken and season with salt and pepper.
4. Place the onion, celery, peas and carrots, garlic and thyme on top of the chicken. Add the broth and push the veggies down into the broth to make sure they are covered.
5. Cover and place the slow cooker on low for 3-3.5 hours.
6. Start checking at 2.5 hours, and continue to cook until rice is cooked through and broth has been soaked up. Keep in mind that every time you lift the lid, you add about 15 minutes to the cook time.
7. Once the rice is cooked to your liking, in a small bowl stir together the greek yogurt, parmesan cheese, and milk.
8. Stir the yogurt/milk/cheese mixture into rice and chicken gently with a large fork to fluff the rice. Taste and adjust seasoning to taste, serve immediately, garnished with fresh parsley if desired.

**FRIENDLY REMINDERS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS**

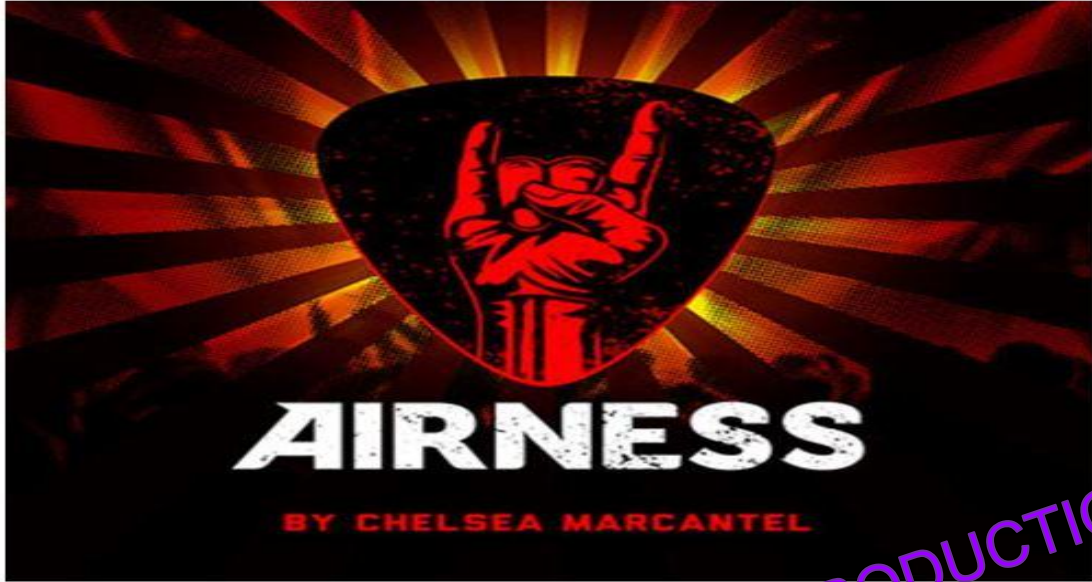
- Attendance Matters, All Day, Every Day -Remember to call the attendance office when your child is absent-419-334-2742
